HeartStrings Pattern: H56 - 8362

WRAPPED UP IN BOWS

A delightful lattice of lace eyelets is embraced by a diamond lace border. The corner design of 1-cord tied into bows gives this wrap its name.

You'll enjoy knitting this wrap with its seamless construction — instructions for each step are given in detail with a schematic to guide you. Also, all lace stitch patterns are presented in both charted and text formats.



Sizing Instructions are given for wraps in three sizes with guidance for alterations in length. Instructions for largest wrap (a full-size stole as pictured on this page) are listed first, with changes for smaller sizes in brackets for medium and narrow width wraps.

Finished measurements: 24 [18, 12½]" by 62" or length desired by working fewer or more repeats of the main body of the wrap.

Yarn and Needles 1000 [750, 525] yards of lace weight yarn. If adjusting length, allow 36 [27, 19] yards for each 2½" 16-row repeat change in finished length. US 4 / 3.5 mm knitting needles suggested.

Gauge: 23 stitches and 28 rows per 4 inches over Main Area stitch pattern after blocking.

HeartStrings Pattern: H57 - 9055

Shallow Tri Shawl

The wide-angle construction of this lace-bordered wrap results in a flattering cross between triangle shawl and long stole. The plain garter stitch center area allows the colors of hand-dyed yarns to be highlighted in a lacy garment in a simple, yet effective way.

The beaded lace border is worked at the same time as the body of the shawl, and frames the shallow triangular garter stitch area on all three sides. Beads are placed on stitch loops with a small crochet hook and knitted in as needed.



To left and right: examples of the Shallow Tri worn in a non-traditional "upside-down" style with center point of shawl layered as a collar.



Sizing 20" long by 62" wide.

Shawl is begun at the point. Length and width can easily be adjusted proportionately by working more or fewer rows before completing the shawl with the upper lace border.

Yarn, Beads and Needles
500 yards of lace weight yarn.
US 2 / 2.75 mm knitting needles suggested.

Gauge: 24 stitches and 33 rows per 4 inches over garter stitch.
280 size 6/0 (4 mm diameter) glass seed beads, approximately 25 g.
US 8 / 1.25 mm steel crochet hook.

If planning to increase size of shawl, please allow for additional yarn and beads as necessary.

HeartStrings Pattern: H46 - 9037

Beaded Offset Chevrons

Hand Warmers and Socks



So delicate and exquisite, the beauty of lace is further embellished with sparkling beads in these eye-catching match-ups for hands and feet.

Yarn, Beads and Needles

Smooth firmly twisted fingering weight yarn and size 8/0 (3 mm diameter) glass seed beads as follows —

For a pair of Hand Warmers: 125 yards yarn and 554 beads (approximately 20 g).
For a pair of Socks: 300 yards yarn and 554 beads (approximately 20 g).

US 1 (2.25 mm) knitting needles or size needed to obtain planned gauge. Your choice of double point or circular needles.

Dental floss threader, split eye beading needle or similar for stringing beads onto yarn.

Gauge

30.5 stitches and 48 rounds = 4" over Beaded Offset Chevrons Pattern Stitch; 32 stitches and 48 rounds = 4" over stockinette stitch

Sizing for Hand Warmers — To fit women's medium with finished circumference around scalloped cuff edge: 8"; around ribbed wrist (not stretched): 5½"

Sizing for Socks — To fit women's medium with finished circumference around scalloped cuff edge: 8"; leg length from top of heel to edge of cuff: 5½"; foot circumference: 7½"; foot length: 9½"
