HeartStrings Pattern: HS3 - 1084 *Peek-a-Bead Scarf*

Bead accents nestle within a honeycomb of colorful knit fabric. Self-shaping edges, along with a pleasingly reversible textured knit/purl design, make this scarf fun to knit and wear.



Shown in Crystal Palace Savannah - 60% Merino Wool 20% Nylon, color # 8308 Monet. Miyuki beads blue-linos White Ceylon #430

This project is good for the advancing beginner because the row has a small number of stitches and the stitch pattern is easy to see and memorize. Peek-a-Bead will also appeal to the skilled knitter looking for some relatively mindless knitting yet something to retain the interest.

Size 6' by 84" washed and lightly blocked

Yarn 400 yards fingering weight

Glass Seed Beads Size 6/0 (4 mm diameter): 214 in a color that contrasts to the yarn (approx 18 g)

Knitting Needles US 6 (4 mm) or size to get gauge

Gauge 7 stitches per inch over pattern stitch (approx 6 stitches per inch over stockinette)

Other Notions

Small crochet hook or similar for placing beads

Tapestry needle for finishing ends

Skill Level Advanced beginner

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Special Techniques Place bead with crochet hook

Construction Worked flat in rows from end to end in one piece, no sewing or grafting

HeartStrings Pattern: H77 - 1086

Buds in the Breeze



As enjoyable to knit as it is lovely to wear. This light-as-a-breeze stole features a field of flower-like medallions centered with nupp "buds".

Even though this stole might appear to have complex shaping, it is knitted in the same number of stitches from end to end. The shaping along the edges is achieved by two things:

1. An illusion created by the varying width of the garter stitch rows along the side edges as they dip into the main stitch area at regular intervals.
2. Accentuating the points during the blocking process (blocking guide photos included in pattern).

Shown in Schaefer Aubrey - 50% Merino Wool 50% Cultured Silk, color Indigo

Size 15" by 72" after tension blocking

Yarn 700 yards light fingering weight

Gauge 18 stitches = 4 inches over blocked lace

Knitting Needles US 6 (4 mm) or size to get gauge

Other Notions Tapestry needle for finishing ends

Blocking board; rust-proof blocking wires/pins

Skill Level Intermediate or adventurous advanced beginner lace knitter; good control over tension is required for making uniform nups

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Special Techniques Estonian nups

Construction Worked flat in rows from end to end in one piece, no sewing or grafting

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HeartStrings Pattern: HB1 - 1085

A Touch of Beaded Class

A touch of beads in alternating light and dark accent colors adds sparkle and stylish class to this lace fashion scarf that is wide enough to be worn as a shoulder stole.



Size 11" by 60" after tension blocking

Yarn 3 - 50 skeins *Colinton 1000* 100% Young Goat Mohair, or total of 345 yards fingering weight

Gauge 18.5 stitches and 22 rows = 4 inches over (blue-ken) main stitch pattern

Knitting Needles US 7 (4.5 mm) or size to get gauge

Glass Seed Beads Size 6/0 (4 mm diameter): 135 dark color beads (approx 1.2g); 168 light color beads (approx 1.5g); dark amber and transparent gold were used in the pictured model

Other Notions

Small crochet hook or similar for placing beads

Tapestry needle for finishing ends

Skill Level Intermediate or adventurous advanced beginner lace knitter

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Special Techniques Place bead with crochet hook

Construction Worked flat in rows from end to end in one piece, no sewing or grafting

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
