HeartStrings Pattern: A185 - 2100

Loganberry



This crescent-shaped shawl begins with a strip of lace edging worked on only 19 to 23 sts with an 8-row repeat. The cabled lace stitch pattern of the edging suggests the slightly oblong shape and seeds of the loganberry. The short-row body of the shawl is an easy, very lacy one-row stitch pattern that knits up in a jiffy.

Finished Size 82" as measured along bottom edge; 65" top edge; 14" center back length; guidance for adjusting the size is included in the project instructions; if adjusting size, plan accordingly for more or less yarn.
Yarn 325 yards (300 m) fingering weight; shown knitted with Mountain Colors *Louisa* cashmere/silk yarn in their 20th Anniversary Retro Color *Loganberry*
Gauge Approximately 6 stitches and 4 1/2 rows = 1" (2.5 cm) over blocked cabled lace edging pattern using smaller size needle
Knitting Needles Size US 7 (4.5 mm) or size needed for gauge; these can be short straight needles or any other suitable needles you prefer for knitting the narrow rows of lace edging
 Size US 8 (5 mm) circular in 32" - 40" (80 - 100 cm) length for knitting the main body (note: a circular needle is used to comfortably hold the number of stitches needed; this garment is not knit in the round)
Other Notions 2 stitch markers; tapestry needle for weaving in cast on and bind off yarn tails
Skill Level Intermediate
Stitch Instructions Charted and written
Special Techniques Crossed stitch to left

HeartStrings Pattern: A146 - 2101

FLAMES OF FALL



Delight yourself with the color and texture of Flames and Fall. Beads and flames of lace endue a soft glow of warmth in this pleasingly reversible stole.
 The sparkle of beads highlight boldly patterned sculptured flame motifs surrounded by a textured border reminiscent of embers.
 The stole is knitted in two pieces, then joined at the middle by an easy method that does not require grafting. The resulting seam is nearly invisible to all but the most discerning eye.

Shown in Crystal Palace Sausalito, color # 8451 Harvest. Miyuki beads color #273 Light Yellow Lined Crystal AB 430



Skill Level Intermediate
Stitch Instructions Charted and written
Special Techniques Place bead with crochet hook; pull-over join
Construction Knitted in two identical pieces that are connected in the middle with a no-graft, pull-over join

Finished Size 16" by 80" blocked outer measurements
Yarn 585 yards (535 m) fingering weight
Knitting Needles Size US 6 (4 mm) suggested
Gauge Approx 19 stitches = 4" over combination of border and main stitch patterns after blocking under tension
Glass Seed Beads 462 size 6/0 (4 mm diameter), approx 40 g

Other Notions Tiny crochet hook small enough to fit through hole of beads
 Tapestry needle for finishing ends
 Blocking board; rust-proof blocking wires/pins

HeartStrings Pattern: H88 - 2099

Sunset Wrap



Circle your shoulders in a soft glow of color.

Sunset Wrap is knitted with a slow striping yarn in a textured beaded lace pattern stitch reminiscent of the hues of backlit clouds along the horizon of a beautiful sunset over a glacial lake.
 This infinity wrap is knit circularly as a large tube with lace eyelets worked on 5 of the 6 pattern rounds. If you have not knit lace where there is lace patterning every row, the Sunset Wrap is a good introduction. And even if you have, you'll enjoy how relaxing and fun this project is.

Because Sunset Wrap is pleasingly reversible, you can wear it in a variety of ways. Ideas shown here are - (top left) double twist fake Moebius shoulder wrap; (bottom left) generously sized twisted loop scarf; (below) or simply worn as a large loop to cover your shoulders and back and draped in front to bring focus to the pretty scalloped edges.



Shown in Crystal Palace Mini Mochi, color #321 Ice Strawberry; Miyuki beads color #274 Amethyst Lined Crystal AB
Finished Size 40" circumference by 16" long (101.6 by 40.64 cm) as measured between outer edges of scallops along top and bottom of the tube; guidance for adjusting the size is included in the project instructions; if adjusting circumference or length, plan accordingly for more or less yarn and beads
Yarn 585 yards (535 m) fingering weight
Gauge 24 stitches and 32 rounds = 4" (10 cm) over blocked stitch pattern (approximately 5 stitches per inch over stockinette)



Knitting Needle 24" - 32" (60 - 80 cm) circular size US 6 (4 mm) suggested
Glass Seed Beads 200 size 6/0 (4 mm diameter), approximately 17 g
Other Notions Stitch markers (optional, but helpful in checking stitch counts)
 Tiny crochet hook small enough to fit through hole of beads
 Tapestry needle for finishing ends
Skill Level Advanced beginner
Skills Needed Knit, purl, yarn over, cast on, bind off
Stitch Instructions Charted and written
Special Techniques Place bead with crochet hook
Construction Knitted circularly in one piece; no seams to sew
