# Thinking of You Too



Say "I'm thinking of you" with a hand knit hat of lace hearts.

Thinking of You Too Hat reflects the bonds of friendship symbolized in HeartString's signature stitch design of cascading interlocked lace hearts.

As you knit this hat, be As you knit this hat, be mindful of how Thinking of You Too reinforces the message that the bonds of loving friendship (interlocking hearts) will prevail in the face of the triets and turns of life. twists and turns of life (wavy eyelet ribbing).

Finished Size Adult medium: unstretched hat is 1947 circumference and 747 long from center of crown; will comfortably fit head circumference 21½7 - 227; use needles one size smaller or larger for adjusting size, or block larger if necessary

Yarn 115 yards (105 m) sport weight; shown knitted with Lorna's Laces *Shepherd Sport* 100% superwash wool yarn in color #45ns *Cranberry* 

Gauge 19½ stitches and 33 rounds = 4" (10 cm) over blocked lace stitch patterns

Knitting Needles
For crown and main body of hat: Size US 6 (4 mm) or size needed for gauge, set of 4 double
point needles and a 16' length circular needle
For center start: Size US 3 (3.25 mm) or US 4 (3.5 mm); set of 4 non-slippery double point
needles

For brim ribbing: Size US 3 (3.25 mm); 16" length circular needle, or 3 sizes smaller than needle used for crown and main body of hat

Skill Level Intermediate

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Construction Center-out starting at crown; worked circularly; no seams to sew

#### **Honeycomb Shadow Lace**



Honeycomb Shadow Lace Stole coordinates a lighter color textured yarn and a darker color smooth yarn to give 3-dimensional illusion of shadows inside the spaces.

Special attention has been paid to the design details of the cast on and bound off edges to produce look-alike scallops in a single piece knitted from one end to the other.

Don't worry if you are thinking this looks like complicated colorwork. You'll actually only be knitting with one yarn at a time in each row. This pattern is much easier than it looks!

Finished Size 14" by 58" (35.5 cm by 147.3 cm) blocked; guidance for adjusting the size is included in the project instructions; if adjusting size, plan accordingly for more or less yarn

Yarn Fingering weight
(1) 225 yards (205 m) slightly textured yarn in a lighter color
(5) 350 yards (320 m) smooth yarn in a darker color

Gauge Approximately 21 stitches and 27 rows = 4\*(10 cm) over blocked stitch pattern Knitting Needles Size US 8 (5 mm) or size needed for gauge

Skill Level Advanced beginner

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Construction Knitted flat from end-to-end; no seams to sew

### Gentle Breezes

Picture early morning walks on gently breaking waves through the morning haze.

the morning haze.
The ends of the stole are
done in a wide lace border
reminiscent of breaking waves.
Beads give a glint of sunlight
off the waves. The main lace
stitch pattern gives the feel of
breezes and the gentle swells
of the ocean.

of the ocean.
Fittingly, for the sample shown here I chose gently variegated gray/blue/green yarn in a color called Ocean Breeze.
But feel free to choose yarn and bead colors to match the picture story you imagine of gentle breezes on a morning or evening walk.

Finished Size 16" by 80" (40.64 cm by 203.2 cm) outer measurements after blocking

Yarn 850 yards (777.24 m) laceweight

**Gauge** 20 stitches x 24.5 rows = 4\* (10 cm) over blocked lace stitch patterns

Knitting Needles Size US 6 (4 mm) suggested

Beads 952 size 8/0 (3 mm diameter) glass seed beads approximately 25 g

Other Notions
Shown in .
Needle for stringing beads
Tapestry needle for grafting and finishing ends
Blocking board; rust-proof blocking wires/pins

Skill Level Intermediate or confident advanced beginner

Stitch Instructions Written and charted

Skills Needed Knit, purl, yarn over, cast on, grafting, stringing beads (optional)

Overview of Construction Begins with 2 identical "Breaking Waves" border pieces knitted separately (if using beads, the beads are strung onto the yarn before knitting each border); one border piece continues in the main area pattern "Gentle Swells" for the body of the stole, then is grafted to other border piece
