Cascading Hearts Shawl

This lace-patterned shawl, adapted from the Faroese style, is contoured and shaped for a natural, excellent drape and fit. The pattern begins with the center back neckband, then proceeds to be worked from the neck down, increasing at the necessary design points to shape the traditional center back panel, side panels, front bands, and fitted shoulders. The panels and garter stitch bands are further defined by working my method of increase stitches that results in the appearance of a "false decrease line." Treat yourself, or someone special, with this practical but elegant creation specially designed with lots of hearts and love!

Sizing
One size, depending on weight of yarn used. See schematic below for dimensions.

Yarn and Needles
Approximately 1075 yards in a lace weight or a jumper weight yarn, for example.
Use 1 ply merino lace weight yarn at 120 yards per cone OR
Use 2 oz shawl/jumper weight yarn at 150 yards per cone.

Size 8 circular needle, or size to obtain planned gauge; is 24" - 28" length (note: a circular needle is used to comfortably hold the number of stitches needed; this garment is NOT knit in the round)

GATGE: in stockinette stitch and after blocking two finishing sections:
5 sts and 12 rows per 2 inches in lace weight yarn
7½ sts and 12 rows per 2 inches in jumper weight yarn

Skill Level: Intermediate knitter with experience knitting lace and reading stitch pattern charts.

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

Eyelot Ankle-Ribbed Socks

These socks are ribbed at the ankle (instead of the top), and comfortably support an eyelot patterned cuff with a pretty scalloped edge. Another petite eyelot pattern decorates the foot.

Sizing
Adult medium

Yarn and Needles
Financing weight sock yarn - approximately 300 yards

Size 1 US G/5 mm double point needles, set of 4 for size to achieve gauge

Gauge: 8 stitches per inch over stockinette stitch

Skill Level: Intermediate knitter with some experience reading stitch pattern charts

Picture model was knitted using Brown Sheep Whitestone wool and nylon sock yarn, color #53-20 machu in the purple.

Abbreviations

k	knit	sl 1	slip 1 stitch as if to knit, and then slip another stitch as if to knit; insert left needle tip into the 2 slipped stitches from left to right and knit these 2 stitches together
kn2tog	knit 2 stitches together	ss (stitch)	slip together
p	purl	WS	wrong side (the side of the knitted fabric: verso in the hand)
psst	pass 2 stitches together	wyb	with yarn in back of work
rep	repeating	wyf	with yarn in front of work

Pendants Shawl

This lace-patterned shawl, adapted from the Faroese style, is contoured and shaped for a natural, excellent drape and fit. The pattern begins with the center back neckband, then proceeds from the neck down in garter stitch and lace stitch motifs. Yarn over increases and the lace patterns themselves are used to shape the traditional center back panel, side panels, front bands, and fitted shoulders. Since this garment knits up easily into a practical and lovely creation without the need for close attention to size and fit, you may find it ideal for gift giving (or even yourself!)

Sizing
One size; see schematic for planned dimensions.

Yarn and Needles
Use 2 oz shawl/jumper weight yarn at approximately 150 yards per cone.

Size 8 circular needle, or size to obtain planned gauge; is 24" - 28" length (note: a circular needle is used to comfortably hold the number of stitches needed; this garment is NOT knit in the round)

GATGE: 4 sts and 6 rows per inch in garter stitch

Skill Level: Advanced beginner knitter with some experience reading stitch pattern charts.

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

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Shawl Lace Patterned Faux Scarf

The popular HeartStrings neck-down version of the Faroese style shawl. Traditional center and side panels, front bands, and fitted shoulders. Garter stitch lace knitting in traditional shawl lace patterns of beads, diamonds and Madama Faux.

Sizing
One size. See schematic below for dimensions.

Yarn and Needles
8 oz shawl yarn at approximately 150 yards per ounce.

Size 8 circular needle, or size to obtain planned gauge; is 24" - 28" length (note: a circular needle is used to comfortably hold the number of stitches needed; this garment is NOT knit in the round)

GATGE: in garter stitch and after blocking two finishing sections:
4 sts and 6 rows per inch in garter stitch

Skill Level: Experienced knitter

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider getting additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

Reversible Lace Cable Scarf

An elegant yet simple lightweight dressy scarf. The main pattern is a mock velvet cable, surrounded by a border of garter stitch and herringbone lace. The choice of a subtly varicolored or multi-toned yarn will introduce a rich amalgamation of gradual color changes into the lace and cable texture.

Shown in a hand-painted multi-color silk/nylon yarn.

Yarn and Needles
400 - 500 yards of laceweight or fingering yarn, approximately 2 to 3 oz for blocked measurements of 17" by 22" length can be easily adjusted for the amount of yarn you have

Gauge: Approximately 4½ st per inch in Herringbone Lace (see Center Border Section)

Size 6 (1.5-1.6 mm) needles

Skill Level: Advanced Intermediate

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

V-Collar Dickey

A fashionable woman's dickey suitable for wearing under a suit jacket, or as a quick dress-up to a V- or crew-neck sweater. A design highlight is the V shape of the collar front that occurs "magically" from a bias-knit twisted rib pattern. The collar back is knit at the same time in a companion plaided twist rib pattern stitch.

The V-Collar Dickey is handsome knitted in a variety of yarns and colors. Choose cool colors for a classic tailored look, or in variegated yarns for a casual look. Model shown here was made in a silky merino/wool Eggplant cotton.

Sizing
Adult medium

Yarn and Needles
Sportweight yarn - approximately 220 yards; choose a medium to high-stretch yarn to enhance the definition of the twisted stitches in the collar ribbing

Size 6 circular needle - gauge needed to obtain planned gauge of 5½ stitches per inch over stockinette stitch - 18" and optional 24" length

Size 4 circular needle, or two sizes smaller than needle used to obtain planned gauge - 16" length

Skill Level: Advanced Intermediate

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

Scrunch-Turtleneck Dickey

A quick and easy-to-knit woman's dickey for a casual dress-up under a crew neck sweater or sweatshirt. I call this a "scrunch-turtleneck" because it is a loose-fitting cross between a turtleneck and a cowl, resulting in a comfortable accessory that will fit any woman.

Sizing
Adult medium to large

Yarn and Needles
Sportweight yarn - approximately 200 yards

Size 4 circular needle, 16" length

Size 6 circular needle for size to obtain planned gauge, 16" and optional 24" length

Gauge: 5 stitches per inch in stockinette stitch on larger needles

Skill Level: Advanced beginner

Picture model was knitted with Cozy Nite 100% Egyptian cotton, color #113006.

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

Side-to-Side Dickey

Practical accessory suitable for the whole family and easy to knit, too. This dickey is made starting at one shoulder of the yoke and is worked in stockinette stitch with moss stitch borders across the front and back sections to the other shoulder. Stitches for the turtleneck are then picked up along the yoke neckband, and knit in ribbing.

The variegated yarn used in this model features how multi-colored yarns work so naturally nicely in the ducky style. Showing off the yarn colors as vertical stripes in the yoke played off horizontal stripes in the collar.

Sizing
Small (up to 13" neck), Medium (14" - 16"), Large (17"-18"); changes for Medium and Large are in the 1" brackets.

Yarn and Needles
Worsted weight yarn - 200(225,250) yards, approximately 3(3½,4) oz

Size 7 (1.5-1.6 mm) needles (or size to obtain planned gauge); these needles can be either straight or circular

Size 5 (1.75 mm) circular needles, 16" length

Size 6 (1.8 mm) circular needles, 16" length

Gauge: 5 stitches per inch in stockinette stitch on larger needle

Skill Level: Advanced Beginner to Intermediate

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

Beaded Diamond Mosaic

Mix-and-match beaded ensemble of hat, crew socks and fingerless mittens. Although the colorwork might appear involved, the slip-stitch color knitting is simple because you only need to handle one yarn color at a time. The beads give an added depth of color and look of complexity to an otherwise simple beaded knitting technique.

Picture model was knitted in Herringbone B color #711 (the "yarn") and color #779 (the "bead"). Model shown here was made in a silky merino/wool Eggplant cotton.

Beaded Diamond Mosaic Hat
Sizes adult S/M/L with finished measurements of 22½ (23½) circumference around head of hat at fullest part; 9½ (10½) overall depth

DK weight yarn - 21(23) yards color A (lighter yarn) 120(140) yards color B (darker yarn)

Size 7 (1.8 mm) / 4.5 mm knitting needles or size to give gauge of 4 stitches per inch over Beaded Basketweave Mosaic pattern stitch, 16" circular and set of double-pointed

90(110)22 size 6/0 seed beads (approx. 75 (80) g)

Crew Socks and Fingerless Mittens
Size 24 (safety) needle, in flat dorsal flexor and/or other collapsing eye needle for strapping bands over your yarn

DK weight yarn for socks - 20 (25, 40) yards color A (lighter yarn) 21 (24, 28) yards color B (darker yarn)

DK weight yarn for fingerless mittens - 20 (25, 40) yards color A (lighter yarn) 16 (19, 23) yards color B (darker yarn)

Custom: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider purchasing additional yarn in some cases if you are adjusting these instructions.

A Bit O' Lace Sport Footies

These short top socks with contrasting sides and heels are nice for sports activities and warm weather. Start at the toe, and proceed to the ankle ribbing that sports a narrow lace edging. The final touch is a lay knitted ribbon tied in a bow at the back of ankle.



The patterned model was made with two Australian yarns from Dharma: 80 Dharma 80 (DK cotton/20% merino) 4/6 yarn - color 007 French Blue © Cotton 8 ply 100% cotton - color 054 Light Periwinkle

Sizing
Adult medium

Yarn and Needles
Main color (M) yarn for the main portion of the sock: approximately 180 yards of sport or DK weight yarn (2 - 11 wraps per inch) in cotton or wool blend appropriate for socks as desired.
Coordinating color (C) yarn for lace edging and ribbon: 30 yards of sport or DK weight yarn in your choice of coordinating or contrast color. This can be the same type of yarn as the main sock, or a different yarn in the same weight or even a slightly lighter weight.
Size 3 mm (US 2 to 3) double point needles, set of 4 or 5 needles, or size to achieve gauge.
Gauge: 6½ stitches per inch over stockinette stitch in M yarn
Size F or G crochet hook
Short piece of smooth yarn or string to be used as waist yarn
Skill Level: Intermediate knitter

Cable Ride

Cable Ride socks feature slipped stitch braided cable ribbing in multi-colored stripes alternating with solid contrasting color.
The picot cuff edging is a nice detail to complement the braided cable ribbing.
Colorful textured ribbing on the legs and smooth ribbing throughout the top of feet make these socks fun to knit and good fitting, too.



Sizing
Adult medium

Yarn and Needles
Fingering weight sock yarn (16 - 17 wraps per inch) in two colors:
Main yarn in a multi-color (M) - 200 yards
Contrasting solid color yarn (C) - 200 yards
Socks pictured were knitted in 80% superwash wool/20% nylon yarn as follows:
(M) Lorna's Laces Shepherd sock in color # 66 Embers
(C) Dharma: single in color # 46 Black
Size 1 to (2.5 mm) double point needles, or size needed to obtain planned gauge, set of 4 or 5 needles
Gauge: 8 stitches per inch in yarn C over stockinette stitch

SUMMER LACE ANKLETS

Lace-edged light cuff socks are designed for comfort and casual-lace yarns, thus making them nice for summertime and those who prefer cotton.



Sizing
Adult medium

Yarn and Needles
Main color (M) yarn for the main portion of the sock: approximately 210 yards of sport or DK weight yarn (2 - 11 wraps per inch) in cotton or cotton blend.
Coordinating color (C) yarn for lace edging: 50 yards of sport or DK weight yarn in your choice of coordinating or contrast color.
Size 3 mm (US 2 to 3) double point needles, set of 4 or 5 needles, or size to achieve gauge.
Gauge: 6½ stitches per inch over stockinette (US 3 M).
Skill Level: Intermediate knitter


The patterned model was made with two Australian yarns from Dharma: 80 Dharma 80 (DK cotton/20% merino) 4/6 yarn - color 001 Dusk Dew © Cotton 8 ply 100% cotton - color 054 Pink

Circle of Friendship Socks

Traveling stitch cables define inter-connected circles, and remind us of the friendships that abound through our knitting. Pattern includes stitch variations for yarn in either variegated or solid colors.



The model pictured at left was made with a variegated yarn: Lorna's Laces Shepherd sock 80% merino wool/20% nylon yarn in color Embers Embers. This thread goes into a good idea of how the stitch pattern will show up in a variegated yarn. You may also select a solid color yarn which further emphasizes the bold role of the stitch pattern for an even more classic look.

Sizing
Adult medium


Yarn and Needles
Fingering weight sock yarn (16 - 17 wraps per inch), approximately 300 yards in either a variegated or solid color.
Size 1 to (2.5 mm) double point needles, or size needed to obtain planned gauge, set of 5
Gauge: 8 stitches per inch over stockinette stitch
Cable needle - optional
Skill Level: Intermediate to advanced knitter. This is a charted pattern. Instructions are given for making the twisted stitch traveling cables either with or without a cable needle.

The Skinny on Lace

Create a statement in lace, and wear it with pizzazz. Slimming chevrons and stylized fleur-de-lis arranged symmetrically in narrow lace bands are knitted from end-to-end in one piece - no grafting or seams to sew.



Three styles are included in this pattern - Sash, Necktie and Long Wrap Scarf - giving you options to knit with anything from lace weight to sport/DK yarn.

Finished size:	4" by 60"	2 1/2" by 40"	4 1/2" by 80"
Materials:	120 yards fingering weight yarn or equivalent (each in one 10 color band)	110 yards lace weight yarn or equivalent (each in one 10 color band)	200 yards sport or DK weight yarn
Suggested needles:	Size 6 US (4.0 mm)	Size 1 US (2.25 mm)	Size 7 US (4.5 mm)
Gauge over pattern after washing and blocking:	5 sts per inch	10 sts per inch	4½ sts per inch
Materials used in pictured model:	New World Textiles 100% natural hemp 6/2	Hansen 100% wool sport 100% fine linen #229	Frank's Yarnery 30% cotton 40% viscose #158

Length is easily adjusted by working more or fewer row repeats.
Please plan for corresponding more or less yarn if adjusting.

An elegant coordinating set of reversible lace scarf, headband, and mitts or mufflers to keep neck, head, hands and arms warm on cool days. The undulating lacy design is reminiscent of a softly flowing river on quiet afternoons. With just two simple lace pattern rows that repeat, any of these items would be suitable for even a beginning lace knitter to make.



Finished Measurements

	Scarf	Headband	Mitts/Mufflers
One size: 10" width, 10" length (Scarf can be easily adjusted for width and length. 2" wide, 10" length, 10" wide, 10" length)	15 x 11 1/2" (with 10" width)	15 x 4 1/2" (with 10" circumference)	15 x 4 1/2" (with 10" circumference)
Yarn - fingering or lace weight of your choice	100 yds	75 (80) yds	130 (150) yds

Finished size: approximately 3" by 9"
Yarn, Beads and Needles
Size 8 pearl cotton thread or equivalent. Yarn color choice needs to be thin, yet strong enough, to carry the beads. 3 colors as follows: red - 14 yards, white or natural - 10 yards, blue - 8 yards
50 glass seed beads size 11/0 in white or pearl, either loose or pre-string
Size 4/0 US (1.25 mm) needles.
Gauge: approximately 14½ stitches per inch over pattern.
Beading needle (if beads are loose)
Note: If you would like a larger (or even smaller) flag, just choose thicker or thinner yarn, and correspondingly sized needles and beads. Plan accordingly for more or less yardage being needed.
Skill Level: Intermediate knitter and comfortable in reading charted instructions

Abbreviations and Special Techniques

BD - knit off a stitch by slipping previous stitch made over at needle - slip next off the needle
L - cast 1 in knitting by slipping a stitch from RH red to LH red, and knit one on RH again
K - knit
K2tog - knit 2 stitches together
M1L - make 1 left-handed into the 2nd slipped stitch from RH red to LH red, and knit one on RH again
M1R - make 1 right-handed into the 2nd slipped stitch from LH red to RH red, and knit one on RH again
P - purl
P2tog - purl 2 stitches together
RS - right hand
RS - right hand
RS - right hand
P - purl
P2tog - purl 2 stitches together

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HeartStrings Pattern A32 - 6038

LACE-EDGED HANKY

An heirloom in the making. Knit a flowing lace edging and attach to a hemstitched handkerchief.



Materials:
 10" square hemstitched handkerchief
 Lace thread, crocheted thread size 30, or similar weight
 Waste thread, a few yards of contrast color in a similar weight to the lace thread
 Size 2/0 knitting needles (1.75 mm)
 Crochet hook size 6 (1.75 mm)
 Tapestry needle size 24

Includes a lesson in how to seamlessly join in the lace edging pattern stitch.

Beaded Garland Mini Holiday Sock

A festive holiday miniature sock for you. Simple beading techniques make this quick to knit, and the results look impressive.

Use for holiday tree trimming, as a sachet filled with herbal mixtures or potpourri, as a gift box decoration, etc. I bet you won't be able to make just one!

Yarn, Needles, and Beads
 These amounts are for a single sock:

- Fingering weight yarn in white or natural color - approximately 20 yards
- 8/0 seed beads - 24 gold, 72 green, 150 red (or your choice of colors)
- Optional - additional beads for making a loop to hang the sock.
- Small jangle bell
- Size US 2 (2.75mm) 3mm double point needles, set of 4
- Collapsing eye needle or sewing needle with eye small enough for stringing the beads e.g. size 24 tapestry needle

Gauge: Approximately 6% sts per inch (since this is decorative, gauge is not critical).

Size: Approximately 4 inches long overall.

Beaded Lace Cable Mini-Study

So delicate and exquisite – the beauty of lace combined with tiny beads! Here are four variations of a lush cable design for you to explore and compare the effect of different beaded lace techniques.

Pattern includes finishing instructions for your choice of bookmarks and bracelets.



Yarn, Needles and Notions
 A fine smooth thread such as size 8 perle cotton, size 10 (crochet thread) or equivalent; approx 35 yards for each bookmark or bracelet.
 Size 11/0 seed beads, approx 2g for each bookmark or bracelet.
 Pair of straight needles in size US 4/0 (2.5 mm) or US 3 (3.5 mm).
 Bead stringing needle - Your choice of any small eye or collapsing eye needle that can pass through the hole in your beads. Examples are a regular sewing needle or a nylon dental fibro thread.
 Optional bracelet clasp - Your choice of toggle and ring closures, hooks and eyes, or similar.

Finished Sizes
 2" x 7" on size 3/0 needles.
 2" x 7" on size 4/0 needles.

Length can easily be adjusted by working more or fewer row repeats.
 Please consider additional yarn and beads if making larger.

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HeartStrings Pattern A35 - 1332

Peaks and Valleys Scarf

Narrow panels of lace play counterpoint against the zig-zagging path of variegated color along this scarf.

Easy to knit on just a few stitches, and enjoyable to wear in a variety of ways.

Yarn and Needles
 Approximately 100 yards of fingering or light sportweight yarn - approximately 2½ - 3½ oz for blocked measurements of 3½ by 68". Length and/or width are easily adjusted for your preference, or to the amount of yarn you have.
 Size 4 us (3.5 mm) needles or size to produce a fabric with a feel that is pleasing to you.
 Gauge: 6% sts per inch over pattern after blocking. Gauge is not terribly important, as scarves do not have to be sized exactly to be enjoyed.

Pictured model was knitted in Heritage Yarns Cotton/Rayon, colorway Spring at Rocky Springs.

Felted Beret

These berets knit up quickly for distinctive gifts.

No need to have flawless spin yarn, so this can be a good project to use with your "beginner" handspun.

Great for using up small amounts and samples, as the mixing of colors just leads to exciting, unique combinations.

Easy machine felting instructions included.

Sizing
 Small Medium, Large. The target beret diameter after felting for each size is -
 Small - 10" diameter, up to hat size 7
 Medium - 11" diameter, hat sizes 7 to 8
 Large - 12" diameter, hat sizes 8 or larger

Samples shown were made in handspun 2-ply worsted wool yarn.

Materials and Tools
 Approximately 4½ to 5½ ounces of wool or wood blend fine superwash spun into a 2-ply worsted weight knitting yarn of 10 - 12 wraps per inch. Loosely spun is better than a tight twist.
 Yarn is used double throughout, in a single color or your choice of several colors from dark to light to make a beret that is uniquely your creation. See sample models in photo for ideas.
 Size 11 US (8.0 mm) 16 - 24" circular needle and double point needles.
 Gauge: about 3 stitches per inch with yarn doubled over stockinette stitch.
 About 1 yard of smooth, strong waste string such as dental floss or crocheted thread.
 For Headband finishing:
 A length of coordinating grosgrain ribbon or narrow inkle-woven band to fit circumference of head plus 1" for waste allowance.
 Coordinating sewing thread
 Sewing needle

Beaded Lace Wristlets

Here are three styles of beaded hand coverings designed for under-the-cuff wear to give the look of layering. Pretty enough to even wear for themselves!

All three styles have a special elegance with their coordinated beaded edging and bead-embellished lace.

The Wrist Warmers feature a slightly fully look that looks fabulous peeking out from the underparts of the cuffs of a blouse or sweater. The beaded pattern looks left on one wrist warmer and right on the other, giving a balanced look to the duo.

The Hand Warmers are styled to cover the back of the hand. This version features a symmetrical mirrored arrangement of the bead-embellished lace on each Wrist warmer. The shaping is done in pattern to conform to the hand.

The Mitts are similar to the Hand Warmers except made larger to cover most of the hand, and incorporate a wider gusset to open the thumb hole. What a flattering alternative to wearing mittens or gloves.

Yet you need a little bit of extra warmth, or you want the look of layered fashion without the extra layers. Directions are included for both men's and women's styles of button plackets.



Sample model of Polo Dickey in the woman's style, knitted in Lorna's Laceos Dye 80% merino / 15% silk. Vero (main color) and Berry (contrast color)

Sizing
Instructions for two sizes: smaller size to fit up to a 15½" neck [larger to fit up to a 18½" neck]

Materials
DK weight yarn - 155(185) yards main color for yoke; 70(85) yards contrast color for collar and plackets
Size US 7 / 3.75 mm circular knitting needle or size to give gauge of 5¼ stitches per inch over stockinette stitch, 20" length or longer.

Note: Polo Dickey is worked back and forth in rows across the shoulders, front and back yokes at the same time for seamless top-down construction; a circular needle is used to comfortably knit the growing number of stitches in each row as the knitting progresses.

Knitting needles in both one size larger and in one size smaller than those used to obtain gauge; your choice of straight or circular needles in 14" length or circular needles in long or longer (used for collar and plackets)

Silk Smoke

Silk Smoke is a versatile accessory you can wear laid on your shoulders as a dressy cover necktie, or pulled over your head as a wrap.

The inherent elasticity and drape of the semi-ribbed lace stitch pattern combined with luxurious silk makes this article a decorative yet functional addition to any outfit.

This smoke ring is knitted circularly to make a seamless tube. Although the lace pattern looks complicated, the spectacular results are accomplished with a stitch sequence that is repetitive and relatively easy.

There are no special knitting techniques needed to make the fluted scallop edge - the shaping occurs naturally as a result of the lace structure of the lace pattern stitch.



Sample model was knitted with Treasury Silk 80 natural Bombyx silk yarn in color #12 Pommegrane. Although smoke ring may be made more traditionally made in natural natural or greyed-down colors, I chose a fun red for the model. Also, it seems there is smoke there is fun!

Sizing
Instructions are written for finished circumference of 22", with changes for 24" and 25½" written in brackets. Finished length is 171(18)".

Yarn and Needles
Although smoke rings are often made in exotic animal fibers such as qiviut and cashmere, silk is also a good choice because of its warmth and softness. Knitted silk is made from the long filaments of silk to produce a high quality shiny silk yarn. The sheen of the silk complements and enhances the texture in the scalloped design of this twisted lace pattern. If using twisted silk as in the pictured model, it is prudent to hand-wash skins into a ball rather than using a mechanical ball winder. An alternative would be to wind the skins onto a large cardboard spool.

Size 2.5 mm / US 4 circular needle or size required to obtain gauge, 16 inch length. If using silk or another slippery yarn, you may want to choose a knitting needle that has a non-sticky surface such as wood, bamboo or coated metal.

Gauge: 7 sts and 8 rounds per inch over lace stitch pattern.

Note: Measurements are taken after thoroughly washing, laying flat and gently blocking with fingers to open up the lace pattern evenly.

Scotch Thistle Lace Stole

A flowing sequence of leaf and flower motifs symbolic of the regal Scotch thistle combine into this beautiful lace stole.

As with the stately thistle where taller leaf stalks form at base of the plant and dainty flower heads adorn tips of the stalks, the lace leaf and flower motifs in this knitted stole transition from taller to shorter.

Select a yarn as soft as thistle down in colors of Scotch thistle as shown, or anything that delights your knitterly senses.

The stole is knitted in two pieces, then joined at the middle by an easy method that does not require grafting. The resulting seam is nearly invisible to all but the most discerning eye.



Sample model was knitted with Scheerle Yarns Arnie 60% merino wool superwash / 20% mohair / 10% nylon

Sizing
Finished size: 15" x 60"

Yarn and Needles
150 yards fingering weight yarn
Size 6 US (4 mm) needles suggested for blocked gauge of 5¼ stitches per inch over stitch pattern

Bella's Beards

This hat is a flapper style, inspired by the movie "Agnatha" with Vanessa Redgrave. Women in the 20's and 30's wore these lovely cloche hats. Laura envisioned one with a beaded band - which started us on the way to creating this hat design. A second inspiration was a biography of Bella, a politician who did a lot for women's issues. Bella was famous for always wearing a hat; hence Bella's Beards.



The design has a beaded roll brim followed by plain knitting, then a beaded band embellished with pearl stitches. Two versions for the crown are given - one with beaded pearl stitches, and the other with beaded garter spokes. For the beaded areas, you will be manipulating two strands of yarn, one with and one without beads. This is a simple way to introduce the beads as needed into the knitting.

Sizing
Medium adult - Finished circumference 20" (21" to fit head) approximately 22 1/2".
Adjust size or snugness of fit by adjusting gauge/needles used.

Yarn and Needles
Sport DK weight yarn as follows -
Luxury yarn (M) 2729 15,365,400 yds for main yarn in 40-home and 40 for accent yarn in 40-home.
Practical yarn (P) 2812 25,374,400 yds for main yarn in 40-home and 20 for accent yarn in 40-home.
If altering planned finished measurements, consider if additional yarn may be needed.

The concept for these colorful tie-dyed looking socks came from a friend who is an avid Aloha Guilt-free fan. The socks are easily finished and comfortable wearing because of the simple ribbed stitch pattern that I designed for a good amount of elasticity. The slipped stitches also add a bit of design interest while nicely breaking up the variegated yarn colors.

Sizing

Adult Small Medium, Large, Extra Large. Instructions for smallest size are given first, with each next larger size in the 1, ..., 11 brackets. Planned finished measurements -

- Leg length: 7"
- Sock foot circumference: 7 1/2" (8 1/2")

 circular needle in 16" length
 1 set double point needles
 Size 6 (4.0 mm) or needle size 1 to 4 sizes smaller than needle to obtain gauge.
 You will need the following needles in this size:
 circular needle in 24" - 32" length
 circular needle in 16" length
 1 set double point needles, or circular needle in 11" length (long sleeve version only)

This is right, gauge is not terribly important in this sweater because you will be knitting to measurements rather than a set number of stitches. The pattern allows to easily for establishing the neck opening and planning yardage based on the indicated measurements. As long as you are close to the indicated gauge of the indicated needles, the pattern size you pick will accommodate the neck opening and be proportionally sized for width and length. You should plan on extra yard if you will be making the sweater longer than the indicated measurements, or your gauge is slightly less than suggested (e.g. 3 1/4 sts/inch). Likewise, you will not need quite as much yarn if you will be shortening, or your gauge is slightly larger (e.g. 3 3/4 sts/inch).


Skill Level:
 Basic knitting skills needed, with familiarity using circular and double point needles.

Caution: Yarn requirements are based on the planned dimensions and gauge stated in this pattern. You may need to consider getting additional yarn in same dye lot if you are adjusting these instructions.

3-4-to-2 Any Gauge Sweater



Use any yarn knit at a suitable gauge for this on-bias sweater. The 3-4-to-2 bias construction in the body of the sweater makes a fabric with extra drape, and offers exciting design possibilities when using variegated yarns or multiple yarns of similar weight knit in easy stripes. Neckline features a fold-down lapel. Options include stockinette or reverse stockinette body texture, and sleeve styles in sleeveless, short, or long.

Sizing
 Adult size. Use the work-along style instructions to plan your top in your desired size. Then just knit and measure as you go.

Yarn
 Select your yarn and appropriate sized knitting needles to make a knit fabric that looks good and feels good to you. A pre-determined gauge is not needed for purposes of knitting this pattern. You can use the start of your sweater as your sample swatch. If you don't like what you are getting, just adjust to something you do. Guidelines for suggested needles and knitting yarn types are shown in the Work-along section of this pattern.

Needles
 For main needles to work front and back body in flat knitting.
 Straight or circular needle in size appropriate for your yarn (see work-along guidelines)
 For neckline garter stitch edging and ribbed bander for bottom of sweater:
 24" - 32" length circular 2 or 3 sizes smaller than main needle
 For your choice of sleeve style in circular knitting, you will also need one or more additional needles as follows:
 sleeveless version: 16" circular needle or set of double point needles 2 or 3 sizes smaller than main needle
 short sleeve version:
 - 16" circular needle in same size as main needle (optional, can use double point needles)
 - 16" circular needle or set of double point needles in same size as main needle
 - 16" circular needle or set of double point needles 2 or 3 sizes smaller than main needle
 long sleeve version:
 - 16" circular needle in same size as main needle (optional, can use double point needles)
 - set of double point needles in same size as main needle
 - set of double point needles 2 or 3 sizes smaller than main needle

Other
 Choice of lapel embellishment, for example a decorative button on pin

Skill level
 Advanced beginner to intermediate
