

Times Two Sideways Reversible Scarf

Imagine the softest of handspun cashmere caressing your neck. The understated elegance of horizontal bands of subtle texture make this scarf handsome on both men and women.

The “times two” reversible technique intermixes yarn that might have differing thicknesses or dye lots, guaranteeing you an overall uniform weight and color. The sequence of two rows is begun on alternating ends of the row in such a way that the yarn carried up the ends of the rows is distributed equally.

The scarf is knitted side to side in rows equivalent to the length of the scarf. Matching cast on and bind off instructions are included.



Size 7" by 85" lightly blocked

Yarn 2 skeins Jade Sapphire Angelwing 100% Handspun Cashmere, 50g/approx 200 yards per skein OR your choice of 400 yards comparable light fingering weight

Knitting Needle 36" - 40" length circular needle, size US 5 (3.75 mm) suggested; although the scarf will be knitted flat, the circular will be used as a two-ended needle to efficiently slide work from one end to the other when changing from one ball to the other

Gauge 14 stitches and 35½ rows = 4" lightly blocked; the pattern stitch in a non-resilient fiber like cashmere has a lot of lateral give compared to its row gauge

Other Notions

- Size H (5mm) crochet hook (used for cast on)
- Tapestry needle for finishing ends

Skill Level Intermediate

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Special Techniques

- Look-alike cast on and bound off edges
- Alternating balls of yarn every two rows from alternating ends of the row
- Repeating each pattern row two times to produce a reversible fabric

Construction Worked flat in rows from side to side in one piece, no sewing or grafting
