

Maple Leaves Scarf

Easy to knit on just a few stitches and enjoyable to wear in a variety of ways. This delicate lace scarf is designed with a knitted lace pattern stitch where the silhouette of yarn over eyelets reminds us of maple leaves.

The attractive textured lace border is knit at the same time as the center area of maple leaves. Thus, the knitting is done entirely from end-to-end in one piece with no picked up stitches or seams to sew.

Finished Size

10" by 64" (25.4 cm by 162.56 cm) after blocking; guidance for adjusting the size of the scarf is included in the project instructions

Yarn

400 yards (365 m) laceweight; if adjusting length or width, plan for correspondingly more or less yarn

Gauge

19.5 stitches x 25.5 rows = 4" (10 cm) blocked; since each main area maple leaf motif is approximately 2.5" by 2.5" (6.35 cm by 6.35 cm), you can use this increment to plan for adjustments in width or length you might want to make

Knitting Needles

Size US 6 (4 mm) suggested



Other Notions

Tapestry needle for finishing ends
Blocking board; rust-proof blocking wires/pins

Stitch Instructions Written and charted

Skill Level Easy

Skills Needed

Knit, purl, yarn over, cast on, bind off

Overview of Construction

Knitted end to end in one piece; no seams to sew
